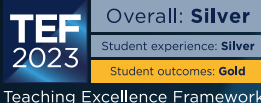

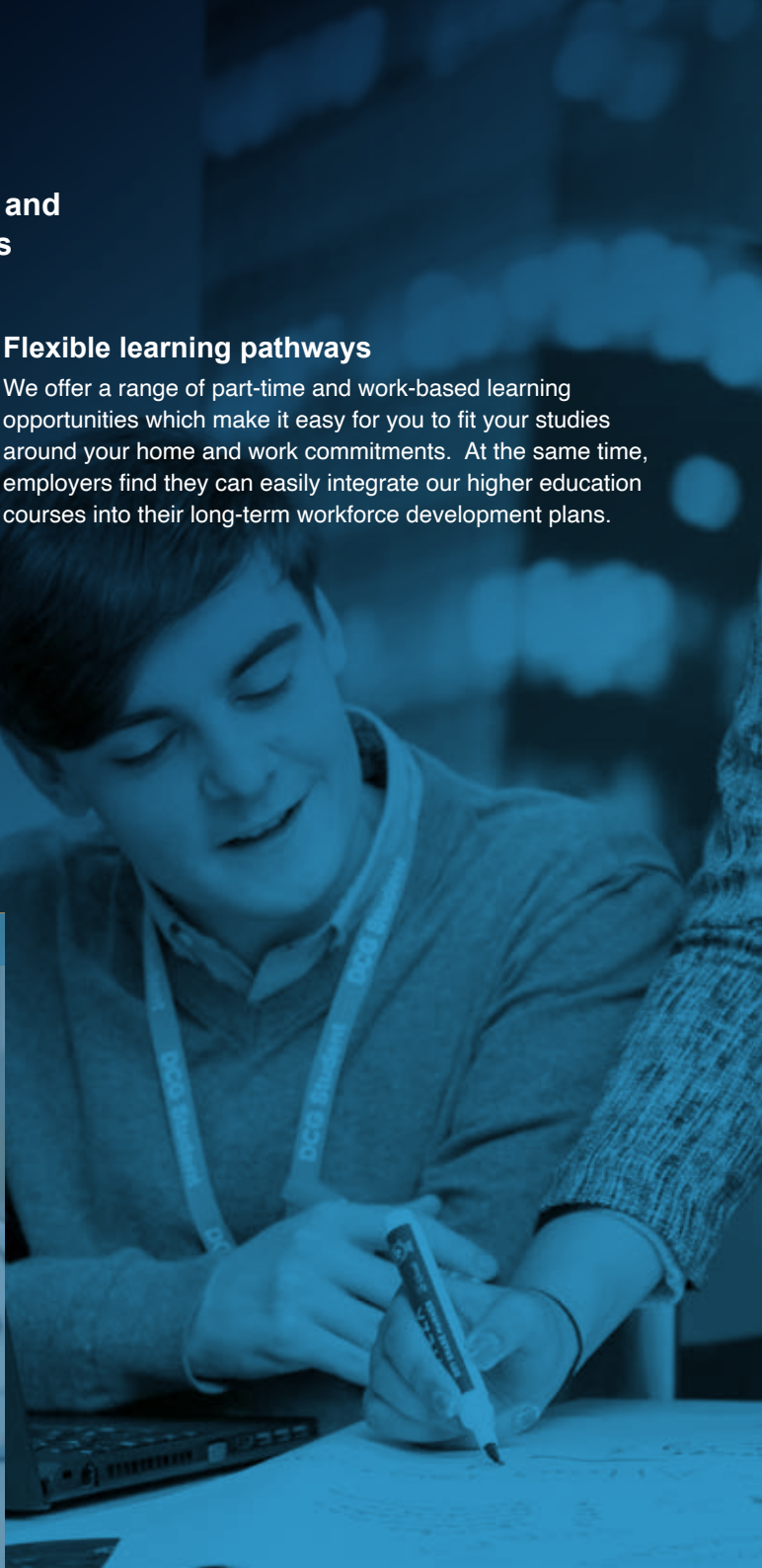

QUALIFICATIONS EXPLAINED

It's very important to choose a course that suits your individual needs, abilities and aspirations. Here is a brief guide to some of the study options available at DCG.

Foundation and Honours Degrees

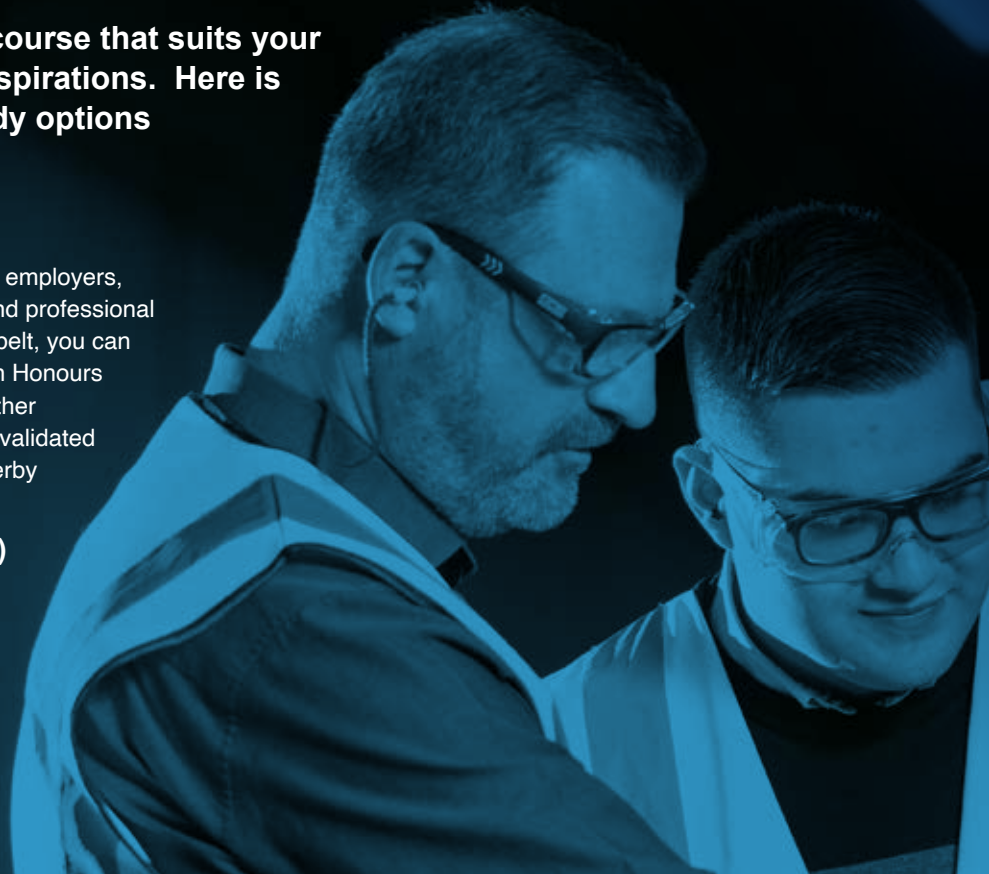
Supported, co-developed and co-delivered by employers, our Foundation Degrees combine technical and professional skills. With a Foundation Degree under your belt, you can often progress directly to the final stages of an Honours Degree – with DCG or at university – or to further professional qualifications. We offer degrees validated by and in partnership with the University of Derby and Sheffield Hallam University.

Higher National Certificates (HNCs)

Employer-focused and vocational, HNCs place greater emphasis on practice rather than theory and offer an alternative route into higher education. They usually take two years of part-time study, although DCG's flexible approach means that other study routes are often available. A HNC sometimes enables you to enter the second year of a degree programme directly.

Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs)

The new HTQs provide an alternative to degrees and apprenticeships. Independently approved against the knowledge, skills and behaviours that employers say they need, they are technical qualifications at Levels 4 and 5. Several courses in DCG's higher education portfolio have been endorsed as HTQs by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education – see page 16 for more information and look out for the HTQ logo in our course guide.



Higher and Degree Apprenticeships

You can achieve university-level qualifications via the 'earn-as-you-learn' route on an apprenticeship programme. Supported by your employer and DCG's expert teachers and assessors, you'll receive training up to degree level. A Higher or Degree Apprenticeship is a chance to fast-track your career and can also lead to professional qualifications: for example, engineers can take steps towards chartered status.

Professional development programmes

Continuing with your professional development is crucial if you want to accelerate your progress up the career ladder. You may need to improve your management and leadership skills, advance your technical know-how, add impressive new qualifications to your CV or turn your talents to teaching. DCG offers a range of specialist programmes at Levels 4 to 6 for individuals keen to advance to more senior roles.

Access to Higher Education

Access to Higher Education Diplomas provide you with a stepping stone to a higher level of study. They are ideal if you are considering a career change, want to return to study or feel you need a more gradual introduction to undergraduate education. They are available to anyone over the age of 19, irrespective of previous qualifications. DCG offers an Access programme in Animal Science.



Are you a current student?

If you succeed in your Level 3 studies with DCG, we can now guarantee you direct progression to one of our higher education courses. Your place is secure as long as you achieve the relevant entry criteria and have a good attendance and performance record. It is also dependent on there being sufficient student numbers for the programme to run.



HOW TO APPLY

Choosing a higher education course is one of the most significant decisions you'll ever make. We offer full support and guidance to ensure you select the right option.

Talk to us

It's important to gather as much information as you can about the course you are considering, including the entry criteria. Then talk to us about your choice and future plans as early as possible. Ideally, speak to a member of the subject team at one of our information events.

Submitting your application

Simply log onto our website at www.derby-college.ac.uk, select your course and fill in your application form online. You'll be invited for an interview where we'll tell you more about your programme and discuss your aptitude and motivation to study. You'll be notified of the outcome in writing.

UCAS applications

The general DCG UCAS number is **D38**. You'll find the UCAS codes for individual courses on the relevant pages of this prospectus. A number of courses ask for UCAS tariff points, allowing you to see if your existing qualifications meet the entry requirements for a particular programme. Changes to GCSE grades

GCSE numeric grades – with 9 being the highest and 1 the lowest – are now introduced in England. The government recognises grade 4 and above as a 'standard' pass in all subjects, representing a similar achievement to the old grade C or above. For English and Maths GCSE, it also categorises a grade 5 or above as a 'strong' pass. Don't hesitate to contact us if you need to know more about entry requirements.

No formal qualifications?

If you lack institutional qualifications, you may still be able to apply for certain programmes. You'll be interviewed and may be set an appropriate piece of work to help us make a judgement. We'll also take into account your academic potential and relevant experience.

The Roundhouse

Technical and Professional Skills College

The Roundhouse on Pride Park is an iconic setting for vocational studies and is now home to a new hub for the East Midlands Institute of Technology (EMIoT). Higher level programmes taught here include those in subjects such as Business; Engineering; Health and Social Care; Professional Construction; and Teacher Training, Coaching and Mentoring.



The Joseph Wright Centre

Post-16 Academic and Arts College

The Joseph Wright Centre boasts exceptional resources for academic studies and advanced vocational programmes. Based in the city centre, it includes IT suites, modern science laboratories, a dance studio, a music basement and a games development suite. It is the current base for our higher education provision in Software Development.



Broomfield Hall

Land-based and Leisure College

Broomfield Hall, a working estate in the Derwent Valley, is the location for our land-based provision, including the Animal Science Access programme and higher level programmes in Animal Management; Equine Science; and Criminal Justice. The campus features impressive facilities, including a library/learning resources centre. With its sports hall and playing fields, it is also the base for our Sport Coaching, Performance and Education Foundation Degree.



What will you need to bring with you?

Depending on your course, you might need to bring your own resources to aid your studies – it could be PPE or other specialist clothing, a laptop or tablet, a scientific calculator and technical drawing equipment, or general stationery. For some courses, you might also be expected to contribute towards the cost of trips and visits relevant to your subject. Further details are available on the web pages for each course.

INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY

The East Midlands Institute of Technology has now opened its doors, with the aim of providing the region's businesses with the skills they need to grow the economy.

DCG is playing a key role in an innovative partnership which will offer its students the very best in technical education.

The East Midlands Institute of Technology (IoT), specialising in engineering, digital, professional construction and leadership skills, has now welcomed its first students.

The IoT represents a pioneering collaboration between DCG, Loughborough College, Loughborough University and the University of Derby, offering everything from T Level and Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) to degree and postgraduate education.

At DCG a new 1,100 square metre extension to the Stephenson Building on the main Roundhouse campus has been established to provide state-of-the-art facilities for IoT students. It caters mainly for the College's higher education students and apprentices working towards industry-informed and e-enabled Level 4 technical qualifications.

The East Midlands IoT enjoys major input from leading-name employers – including Rolls-Royce plc, Bloc Digital, Fujitsu, Alstom, National Grid/ESO, Uniper and Toyota – who are helping to shape the curriculum and extend opportunities for students to gain hands-on experience.

An important aim is to develop advanced skills for the digital and low carbon sectors. One latest development has seen the East Midlands Freeport invest more than £2m in building the talent needed by firms to promote clean energy and decarbonise industry. Its Future Energy Skills Hub (FESH) project is led by the IoT and courses such as DCG's Manufacturing Engineering degree will contribute to its objectives.

INTRODUCING HIGHER TECHNICAL QUALIFICATIONS

DCG is part of the drive to make higher technical education a prestigious and popular choice to get ahead in your career.

Higher Technical Qualifications (HTQs) provide you with a new route to career advancement, giving you extra choice and flexibility in how and where you study.

DCG is at the forefront of delivering HTQs as a high-quality vocational alternative to more traditional university degrees and apprenticeships.

HTQs are Level 4 and 5 qualifications that sit between Level 3 qualifications – such as A-levels or T Levels – and Honours Degrees. They can lead to high-skilled, highly paid jobs in a wide range of sectors, giving you a step up in your chosen career or providing a seamless transition to further study.

Including qualifications such as HNDs and Foundation Degrees, they have been independently approved against the knowledge, skills and behaviours employers say they need. They are therefore a trusted route for firms to ensure their workforce is equipped for the future.

DCG now offers various HTQs which have been endorsed by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education. The portfolio includes HNCs and Foundation Degrees in subjects such as Engineering, Health and Social Care, Professional Construction and Software Development.

MONEY MATTERS

Choosing to study a higher education course is a real investment in your future, leading to better career prospects and greater earning potential. We'll provide all the advice and support you need to overcome any financial concerns you may have.

An affordable option

Higher education fees with Derby College Group are competitive and studying locally also means you won't face significant accommodation and transport costs. You can pay for your course through:

- a direct payment to us
- sponsorship from an employer
- a student loan

Student loans

The Student Loans Company administers financial support for higher education. If you apply for a loan:

- you don't have to pay fees up front
- you don't need to pay back anything until after you have completed your programme and are earning over a certain amount per year
- you won't pay anything back at all if you never reach that salary level

Depending on your household income, you may also be eligible for a maintenance loan to cover your living costs.

Applying for a loan

If you apply for a loan, you'll need to complete an online form each year you study. Your tuition fee will automatically be paid to us. It makes sense to apply for student finance as early as possible. You can do so as soon as finance applications are open and you've accepted an offer – you don't have to wait until you've achieved all your entry grades.

Disabled Students' Allowance

You can apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) if you have a disability (as defined under the Equality Act 2010), long-term health condition, mental health condition or specific learning difficulty such as dyslexia. The support depends on your individual needs and not on your income.

The DSA pays for extra support, which could be help with study skills – such as dedicated support for dyslexia or for specialist equipment such as electronic note-taking software.

Advanced Learner Loan

You could also qualify for a loan if you're taking other programmes at Level 3 or above, including our Access to Higher Education Diploma. The Advanced Learner Loan provides a financial support package similar to that available to university undergraduates. You can access a loan from the Student Loans Company which you only need to repay once you have completed your studies and when your earnings reach a certain point. Your household income and employment status are not taken into account and there are no credit checks.

Our Access course is the perfect stepping stone to higher education for animal enthusiasts of all ages and backgrounds.

This new Access course enables you to ease yourself back into studying and build your confidence – all in a friendly and supportive environment. Ideal if you are seeking a career change or want to secure a more senior animal care role, it helps you progress to a Foundation Degree, job or apprenticeship in animal science.

With its strong vocational focus, the Diploma covers both theory and practice in areas including animal evolution, biodiversity, mammalian reproduction, aquatic husbandry and research skills, plus 100 hours of work experience.

Throughout you'll enhance your study skills so that you can advance to the next level of learning such as one of our acclaimed Foundation Degrees. If you've not already achieved GCSE English and Maths at grades C/4 or above – or Functional Skills at Level 2 – this will form part of your study programme.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- GCSE English and Maths at grade 3/D or Level 1 Functional Skills.
- A strong interest in animal/equine management or environmental conservation.
- A minimum of two weeks in a relevant work placement.



Foundation Degree Animal Management (FdSc)

You can gain a solid introduction to all aspects of animal management – with this inspiring Foundation Degree.

This Foundation Degree equips you with the right aptitude and attitude to work within the animal management sector. You'll develop your hands-on skills and theoretical knowledge through a fascinating range of academic study, practical classes and industrial visits.

The course comprises 12 modules reflecting the diverse nature of animal management, from anatomy and physiology to health and welfare, exotic mammals to animal breeding programmes, domestic and captive animals to research methods and scientific communication. It also includes work-based learning equivalent to one day per week and we can support you to find an appropriate placement.

Your Foundation Degree qualification will pave the way for you to pursue a new career – or advance an existing career – in a wide variety of animal management fields. It also provides an ideal platform to top up your qualification to an Honours Degree covering subjects such as human-animal interactions, animal training, animal welfare science and business enterprise.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- 64 UCAS points in a relevant subject area.
- Four GCSEs at grades 9-4 (A*-C) – or the equivalent – to include English, Maths and a Science.

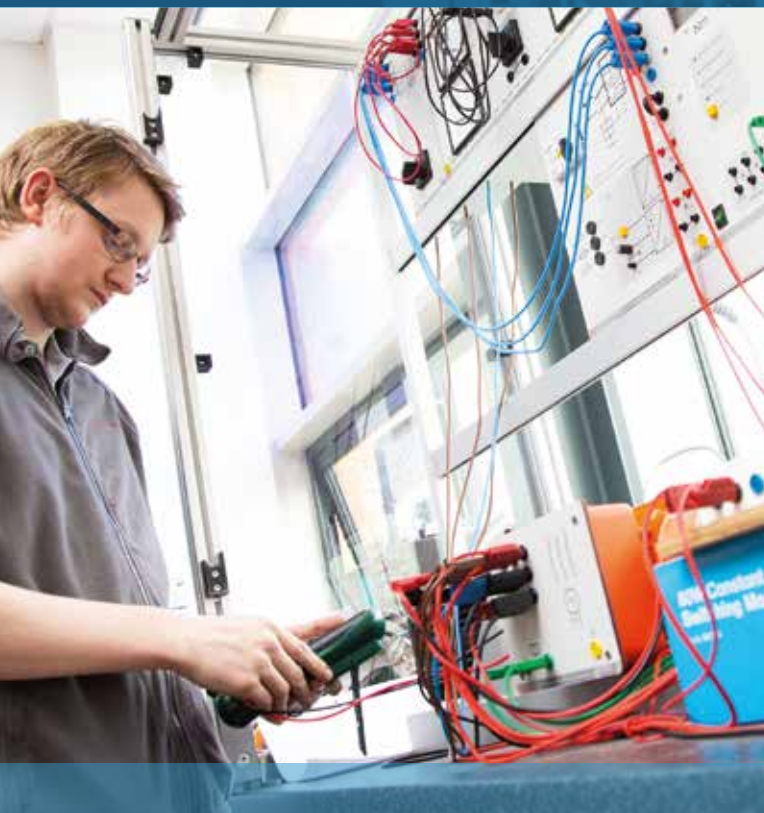

In addition, you may choose to build on your knowledge by applying for postgraduate studies.

- A Foundation Degree in a relevant subject such as Criminal Justice or Public Services – you must have attained 120 credits at Level 5.
- A HND in Public Services or the equivalent.

In the time he has been teaching, 95% of his apprentices have successfully come through their End Point Assessments - 60% with distinctions.*

It gives you the opportunity to earn as you learn, while exploring the role of the teacher in the FE and Skills sector and considering various creative teaching, learning and assessment approaches. You'll cover the roles and responsibilities of a teacher; learners and learning; classroom management; curriculum design; and becoming a subject specialist.

On completing the programme, you'll be able to achieve professional formation (QTLS) and progress to a permanent teaching position in Post-14 education including schools, FE colleges, training providers and prison education services. Depending on your prior qualifications, you could also consider taking your academic studies to the next level with a BA (Hons) Education Studies or Masters in Education.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Teacher apprenticeship contract of at least two years.
- At least a Level 3 qualification in your subject specialism.
- Approved Level 2 qualifications in English Language and Maths (or a commitment to achieve these).
- A mentor within your organisation to support you.

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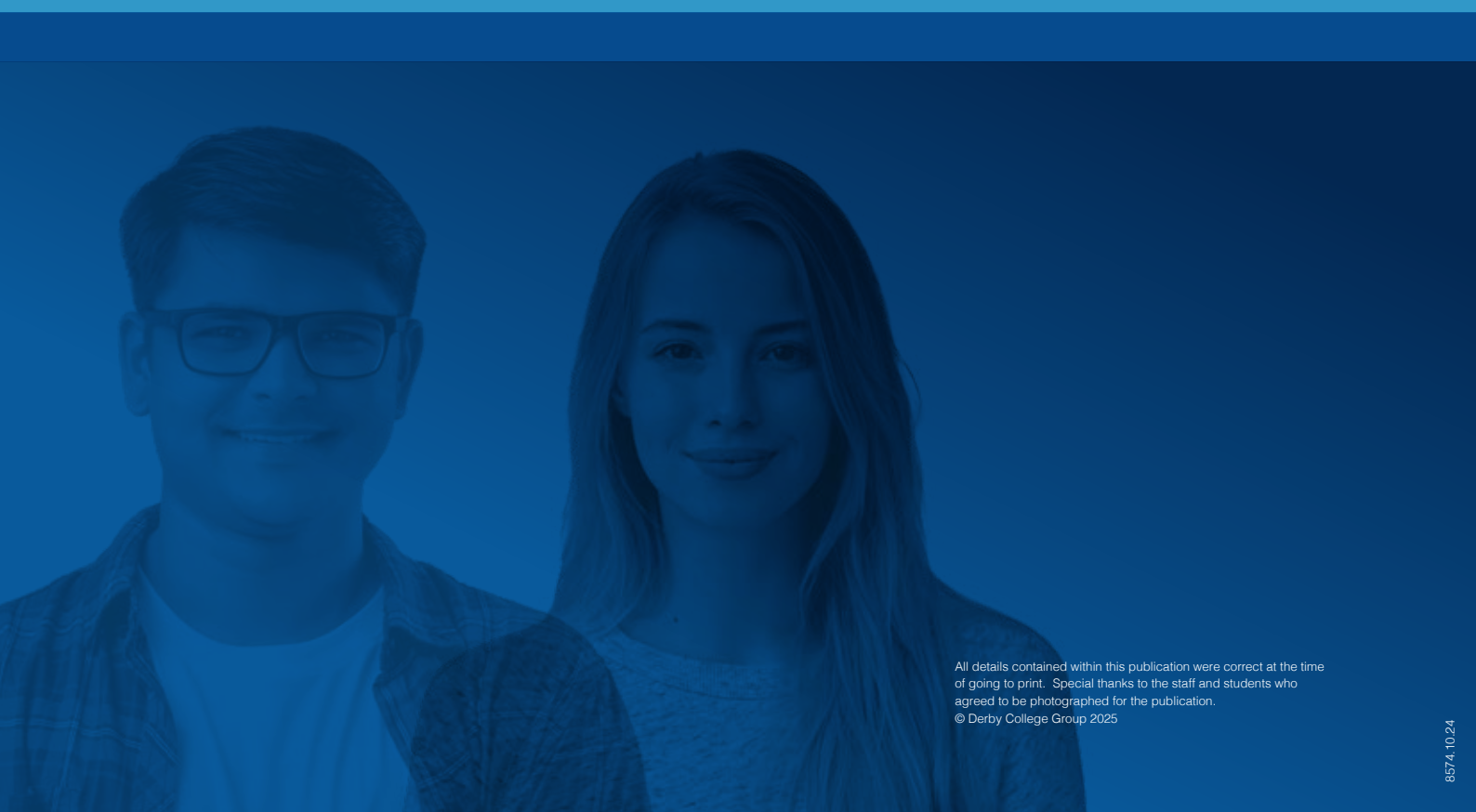
